FINDING

There being a finding/verdict of **GUILTY**, defendant has been convicted as charged of the offense(s) of:
Conspiracy to Distribute Controlled Substances in violation of Title 21 U.S.C. § 846 as charged in Count 1 of the 12-Count Indictment; and Conspiracy to Launder Money in violation of Title 18 U.S.C. § 1956(h) as charged in Count 2 of the 12-Count Indictment

**JUDGMENT
AND PROB/

ORDER**

The Court asked whether there was any reason why judgment should not be pronounced. Because no sufficient cause to the contrary was shown, or appeared to the Court, the Court adjudged the defendant, **MARC PETER WILLEMS**, guilty as charged and convicted and ordered that: Pursuant to the Sentencing Reform Act of 1984, it is the judgment of the Court that the defendant is hereby committed on Counts 1 and 2 of the Indictment to a term of: **ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE (121) MONTHS**. This term consists of 121 months on each of Counts 1 and 2, to be served concurrently.

It is ordered that the defendant shall pay to the United States a special assessment of \$200, which is due immediately. Any unpaid balance shall be due during the period of imprisonment, at the rate of not less than \$25 per quarter, and pursuant to the Bureau of Prisons' Inmate Financial Responsibility Program.

Pursuant to Guideline Section 5E1.2(a), all fines are waived as the Court finds that the defendant has established that he is unable to pay a fine and is not likely to become able to pay any fine.

Upon release from imprisonment, the defendant shall be placed on supervised release for a term of **FIVE (5) YEARS**. This term consists of five years on Count 1, and three years on Count 2, all such terms to run concurrently under the following terms and conditions:

1. The defendant shall comply with the rules and regulations of the United States Probation Office and General Order 05-02;
2. The defendant shall not commit any violation of federal, state, or local law or ordinance;
3. The defendant shall refrain from any unlawful use of a controlled substance. The defendant shall submit to one drug test within 15 days of release from imprisonment and at least two periodic drug tests thereafter, not to exceed eight tests per month, as directed by the Probation Officer;
4. During the period of community supervision the defendant shall pay the special assessment in accordance with this judgment's orders pertaining to such payment;
5. Before using a computer or computer-related device capable of accessing the Internet, screen name,

password, e-mail account or ISP for the first time, defendant shall notify his Probation Officer. Computers and computer-related devices include, but are not limited to, personal computers, personal data assistants (PDAs), Internet appliances, electronic games, and cellular telephones, as well as their peripheral equipment, that can access or be modified to access the Internet, electronic bulletin boards, and other computers, or similar media;

6. After notifying his Probation Officer about a particular computer, computer-related device, screen name, password, e-mail account or ISP, defendant need not notify the officer about subsequent use of that particular item. Defendant shall, however, notify his Probation Officer of any additions to, removals from, upgrades of, reinstallations of, repairs of, or other modifications of the hardware or software on any computers, computer-related devices, or peripheral equipment in the aforementioned items within one week of the change;
7. Defendant shall provide his Probation Officer with all billing records for phone, cable, Internet, and satellite services that he purchases, as requested by the Probation Officer, so that his Probation Officer can verify his compliance with these requirements;
8. All computers, computer-related devices and their peripheral equipment used by defendant shall be subject to search and seizure by making a mirror image of the device or searching the computer on-site. The defendant shall not hide or encrypt files or data without prior approval from the Probation Officer;
9. The defendant shall comply with the rules and regulations of the Computer Monitoring Program. The defendant shall pay the cost of the Computer Monitoring Program, in an amount not to exceed \$32 per month per device connected to the Internet;
10. The defendant shall comply with the immigration rules and regulations of the United States, and if deported or removed from this country, either voluntarily or involuntarily, not reenter the United States illegally. The defendant is not required to report to the Probation Office while residing outside of the United States; however, within 72 hours of release from any custody or any reentry to the United States during the period of Court-ordered supervision, the defendant shall report for instructions to the United States Probation Office, located at the United States Court House, 312 N. Spring Street, Room 600, Los Angeles, CA 90012; and
11. The defendant shall cooperate in the collection of a DNA sample from the defendant.

The Statement of Reasons shall be provided to the United States Probation Office, United States Sentencing Commission, and the Bureau of Prisons.

The Court authorizes the Probation Office to disclose the Presentence Report to the Bureau of Prisons and the United States Sentencing Commission.


The Court dismisses any remaining counts as to this defendant.

The Court informs the defendant of his right to appeal.

In addition to the special conditions of supervision imposed above, it is hereby ordered that the Standard Conditions of Probation and Supervised Release within this judgment be imposed. The Court may change the conditions of supervision, reduce or extend the period of supervision, and at any time during the supervision period or within the maximum period permitted by law, may issue a warrant and revoke supervision for a violation occurring during the supervision period.

STANDARD CONDITIONS OF PROBATION AND SUPERVISED RELEASE

While the defendant is on probation or supervised release pursuant to this judgment:

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| <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The defendant shall not commit another Federal, state or local crime; 2. the defendant shall not leave the judicial district without the written permission of the court or probation officer; 3. the defendant shall report to the probation officer as directed by the court or probation officer and shall submit a truthful and complete written report within the first five days of each month; 4. the defendant shall answer truthfully all inquiries by the probation officer and follow the instructions of the probation officer; 5. the defendant shall support his or her dependents and meet other family responsibilities; 6. the defendant shall work regularly at a lawful occupation unless excused by the probation officer for schooling, training, or other acceptable reasons; 7. the defendant shall notify the probation officer at least 10 days prior to any change in residence or employment; 8. the defendant shall refrain from excessive use of alcohol and shall not purchase, possess, use, distribute, or administer any narcotic or other controlled substance, or any paraphernalia related to such substances, except as prescribed by a physician; 9. the defendant shall not frequent places where controlled substances are illegally sold, used, distributed or administered; | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 10. the defendant shall not associate with any persons engaged in criminal activity, and shall not associate with any person convicted of a felony unless granted permission to do so by the probation officer; 11. the defendant shall permit a probation officer to visit him or her at any time at home or elsewhere and shall permit confiscation of any contraband observed in plain view by the probation officer; 12. the defendant shall notify the probation officer within 72 hours of being arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer; 13. the defendant shall not enter into any agreement to act as an informer or a special agent of a law enforcement agency without the permission of the court; 14. as directed by the probation officer, the defendant shall notify third parties of risks that may be occasioned by the defendant's criminal record or personal history or characteristics, and shall permit the probation officer to make such notifications and to conform the defendant's compliance with such notification requirement; 15. the defendant shall, upon release from any period of custody, report to the probation officer within 72 hours; 16. and, <u>for felony cases only</u>: not possess a firearm, destructive device, or any other dangerous weapon. |
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The defendant will also comply with the following special conditions pursuant to General Order 01-05 (set

forth below).

STATUTORY PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO PAYMENT AND COLLECTION OF FINANCIAL SANCTIONS

The defendant shall pay interest on a fine or restitution of more than \$2,500, unless the court waives interest or unless the fine or restitution is paid in full before the fifteenth (15th) day after the date of the judgment pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §3612(f)(1). Payments may be subject to penalties for default and delinquency pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §3612(g). Interest and penalties pertaining to restitution, however, are not applicable for offenses completed prior to April 24, 1996.

If all or any portion of a fine or restitution ordered remains unpaid after the termination of supervision, the defendant shall pay the balance as directed by the United States Attorney's Office. 18 U.S.C. §3613.

The defendant shall notify the United States Attorney within thirty (30) days of any change in the defendant's mailing address or residence until all fines, restitution, costs, and special assessments are paid in full. 18 U.S.C. §3612(b)(1)(F).

The defendant shall notify the Court through the Probation Office, and notify the United States Attorney of any material change in the defendant's economic circumstances that might affect the defendant's ability to pay a fine or restitution, as required by 18 U.S.C. §3664(k). The Court may also accept such notification from the government or the victim, and may, on its own motion or that of a party or the victim, adjust the manner of payment of a fine or restitution-pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §3664(k). See also 18 U.S.C. §3572(d)(3) and for probation 18 U.S.C. §3563(a)(7).

Payments shall be applied in the following order:

1. Special assessments pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §3013;
2. Restitution, in this sequence:
 - Private victims (individual and corporate),
 - Providers of compensation to private victims,
 - The United States as victim;
3. Fine;
4. Community restitution, pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §3663(c); and
5. Other penalties and costs.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR PROBATION AND SUPERVISED RELEASE

As directed by the Probation Officer, the defendant shall provide to the Probation Officer: (1) a signed release authorizing credit report inquiries; (2) federal and state income tax returns or a signed release authorizing their disclosure; and (3) an accurate financial statement, with supporting documentation as to all assets, income and expenses of the defendant. In addition, the defendant shall not apply for any loan or open any line of credit without prior approval of the Probation Officer.

The defendant shall maintain one personal checking account. All of defendant's income, "monetary gains," or other pecuniary proceeds shall be deposited into this account, which shall be used for payment of all personal expenses. Records of all other bank accounts, including any business accounts, shall be disclosed to the Probation Officer upon request.

The defendant shall not transfer, sell, give away, or otherwise convey any asset with a fair market value in excess of \$500 without approval of the Probation Officer until all financial obligations imposed by the Court have been satisfied in full. These conditions are in addition to any other conditions imposed by this judgment.
